Steps to join Kehilat Sukkat Shalom:

- 1. **Review the Mission, Vision and Values.** These can be found on pages 2 3 of this document. Please verify that you understand and are comfortable with the basic tenets of Sukkat Shalom. These are the principles that guide our decisions and policies.
- 2. Determine the contribution you will pledge. Sukkat Shalom is dedicated to the principle that no one will ever be excluded from membership for financial reasons.

The recommended annual pledge for FY 2022 - 2023 (Organization fiscal year started 7/1/22 and will end 6/30/23) is \$432 per single person and \$864 per couple/family.

- This works out to \$36.00 per month for individuals and \$72.00 per month for couples or families. If you are able to give more, your contribution will strengthen this community. If you are not able to contribute at this membership level, please select a pledge that is financially feasible for you and that reflects the value we represent in your life. Your membership, regardless of your financial contribution, is important to us.

ADDENDUM: Pastoral Care Information for Sukkat Shalom members

Sukkat Shalom provides for some limited traditional "pastoral care" activities for members. These include:

- a. Visiting the sick
- b. Shiva meals

c. One time conversations around religious/spiritual aspects of personal discernment, family planning, end of life issues, etc., scheduled with chaplain Jack Schwarz, 614-893-4564.

For other life cycle events and learning such as preparation for a bar/bat mitzvah, or other extended pastoral support, while one initial conversation may be included as part of item "c" above, related compensation for time should be arranged separately; contact the Kehilah Chair, <u>Jodi</u>, or Vice Chair, <u>Cheryl</u>, for more information.

Examples of these events to be contracted separately include:

- a. Bar or Bat Mitzvah
- b. Baby naming
- c. Wedding
- d. Conversion
- e. Celebration of Life/Funeral Service
- f. Tutoring
- g. Hebrew language study

Other ways that Sukkat Shalom can support member lifecycle events:

Space: Events can be scheduled in conjunction with Kehilah events and/or use Kehilah resources through advance planning.

Torah: Sukkat Shalom can make arrangements for the loan of a Torah from Agudas Achim as needed. These arrangements need to be made well in advance, and members are invited to contribute toward an annual donation Sukkat Shalom makes to Agudas Achim in appreciation of this support.

Prayer Books: If the Kehilah books or booklets are used, a donation towards maintaining these materials is greatly appreciated. Members may choose to create a personalized prayer service at their own expense.

Musical support: Members should make these arrangements directly with musicians.
